**BILL** 

Entitled

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE TWO BILLION, EIGHT HUNDRED FORTY SIX MILLION, EIGHT HUNDRED AND THIRTY THREE THOUSAND, EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY SEVEN DOLLARS, TO THE SERVICE OF THE YEAR ENDING 31<sup>ST</sup> DECEMBER 2012

ENACTED by the National Parliament of Solomon Islands.

Short title and commencement

1. This Act may be cited as the 2012 Appropriation Act 2012.

Authorisation of \$2,846,833,897

2. The issue from the Consolidated Fund is hereby authorised of a sum of two billion, eight hundred and forty six million, eight hundred and thirty three thousand, eight hundred and ninety seven dollars, to be applied to the service of the year ending 31<sup>st</sup> December 2012.

Appropriation

3. The sum specified in section 2 shall be appropriated for the supply of the heads specified, and in the amounts respectively specified in relation thereto, in the First Schedule.

Overdrafts and advances

4. The Government may, at any time or times not later than the 31<sup>st</sup> December 2012, borrow by way of overdraft and advances within or outside Solomon Islands, any sum not exceeding in the whole one hundred million dollars on such terms and conditions as the Minister of Finance ("Minister") may deem expedient.

Development and rehabilitation loans

- 5. (1) The Government may, in addition to its borrowings under section 4, borrow or enter into agreements to borrow on such terms and conditions as it may determine amounts up to such sums of money for such purposes and from such sources as are respectively specified in the first, second and third columns of the Second Schedule.
  - (2) No amounts may be borrowed under subsection (1) except in accordance with an agreement under that subsection entered into on or before 31<sup>st</sup> December 2012.
  - (3) The Government shall not borrow any sum or sums in excess of the figure shown in the first column of the Second Schedule, except with the resolution of Parliament pursuant to section 32 of the Public Finance and Audit Act (Cap.120).
  - (4) The Minister shall report to Parliament at the meeting next following such borrowing or agreement of any borrowing or the making of any agreement to borrow under subsection (1).

Advance warrants

6. The total sums authorised by advance warrants issued by the Minister in exercise of his powers under section 13 of the Public Finance and Audit Act (Cap. 120) for the financial year 2012 shall not at any one time exceed one hundred million dollars.

7. The total sums authorised by contingencies warrants issued by the Minister under section 15 of the Public Finance and Audit Act (Cap. 120) for the financial year ending 31<sup>st</sup> December 2012 shall not exceed the following amounts –

Contingencies warrants

- (a) in respect of Heads of Recurrent Expenditure, twenty five million dollars;
- (b) in respect of Heads of Development Expenditure, twenty million dollars.

#### **OBJECTS AND REASONS**

The object of this Bill is to authorise expenditure of \$2,846,833,897 for the services of the Government in respect of the year 2012. There will be no net domestic borrowing in 2012.

The Bill seeks to authorise the Government to borrow from external sources up to the specified amounts to be applied for development and rehabilitation purposes. Provisions relating to the issue by the Ministry of Finance and Treasury of Advance Warrants and Contingencies Warrants during 2012 are also included.
