**AN ACT** TO APPROPRIATE THREE BILLION, THREE HUNDRED AND THIRTY FOUR MILLION, FOUR HUNDRED AND SIXTY ONE THOUSAND, NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTY SIX DOLLARS TO THE SERVICE OF THE YEAR ENDING 31<sup>ST</sup> DECEMBER 2014.

**ENACTED** by the National Parliament of Solomon Islands.

Short title and commencement

1. This Act may be cited as the 2014 Appropriation Act 2013.

Authorisation of \$3,334,461,956

2. The issue from the Consolidated Fund is hereby authorised of a sum of three billion, three hundred and thirty four million, four hundred and sixty one thousand, nine hundred and fifty six dollars, to be applied to the service of the year ending 31<sup>st</sup> December 2014.

Appropriation

3. The sum specified in section 2 shall be appropriated for the supply of the heads specified, and in the amounts respectively specified in relation thereto, in the First Schedule.

Short Term Discount Securities

- 4. (1) The Government may, at any time or times not later than 31<sup>st</sup> December 2014, borrow by way of short-term discount securities, issued within Solomon Islands, any sum not exceeding in the whole one hundred million dollars on such terms and conditions as the Minister of Finance may deem expedient.
  - (2) Proceeds from any borrowing under subsection (1) are only to be used in accordance with section 71 of the *Public Financial Management Act 2013*.

Development and rehabilitation loans

- 5. (1) The Government may, in addition to its borrowings under section 4, borrow or enter into agreements to borrow on such terms and conditions as it may determine amounts up to such sums of money for such purposes and from such sources as are respectively specified in the first, second and third columns of the Second Schedule.
  - (2) No amounts may be borrowed under subsection (1) except in accordance with an agreement under that subsection entered into on or before 31<sup>st</sup> December 2014.
  - (3) The Government shall not borrow any sum or sums in excess of the figure shown in the first column of the Second Schedule, except in accordance with *Part 8* of the *Public Financial Management Act 2013*.
  - (4) The Minister shall report to Parliament in accordance with section 66(5) of the *Public Financial Management Act 2013* following such borrowing under subsection (1).

Advance warrants

6. The total sums authorised by advance warrants issued by the Minister in exercise of his powers under section 60 of the *Public Financial Management Act 2013* for the financial year 2014 shall not at any one time exceed one hundred and fifty million dollars.

7. The total sums authorised by contingencies warrants issued by the Minister under section 58 of the *Public Financial Management Act 2013* for the financial year ending 31<sup>st</sup> December 2014 shall not exceed the following amounts –

Contingencies warrants

- (a) in respect of Heads of Recurrent Expenditure, twenty four million, six hundred thousand dollars;
- (b) in respect of Heads of Development Expenditure, ten million dollars.

#### **OBJECTS AND REASONS**

The object of this Bill is to authorise expenditure of three billion, three hundred and thirty four million, four hundred and sixty one thousand, nine hundred and fifty six dollars for the services of the Government in respect of the year 2014.

There will be no net domestic borrowing in 2014.

The Bill seeks to authorise the Government to borrow from external sources up to the specified amounts to be applied for rehabilitation and development purposes. Provisions relating to the issue by the Ministry of Finance and Treasury of Advance Warrants and Contingencies Warrants during 2014 are also included.
