

AN ACT to appropriate five million five hundred and fifty one thousand five hundred and sixty five dollars to the service of the year ending the 31st December 1984.

ENACTED by the National Parliament of Solomon Islands.

Development Loans. 4. (1) The Government may, in addition to its borrowing under the provisions of section 4, borrow or enter into agreements to borrow on such terms and conditions as it may determine amounts up to such sums of money for such purposes and from such sources as are respectively specified in the first, second and third columns of the second schedule.
