

AN ACT To Appropriate thirty million seven hundred and twenty eight thousand six hundred and forty four dollars to the service of the year ending 31st December 1994.

ENACTED by the National Parliament of Solomon Islands.

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the 1994 Supplementary Appropriation Act 1994.

Authorisation of issue from the Consolidated Fund of \$30,728,644 to the service of 1994.

2. The issue from the Consolidated Fund is hereby authorised of the sum of thirty million seven hundred and twenty eight thousand, six hundred and forty four dollars to be applied to the service of the year ending 31st December 1994.

Appropriation.

3. The sum specified in the preceding section shall be appropriated for the supply of the heads specified, and in the amounts respectively specified in relation thereto, in the Schedule to this Act.

Amendment of Section 4 of Act No. 7 of 1993. 4. Section 4 of the 1994 Appropriation Act 1993 is hereby amended by deleting the words "eighteen million" and substituting therefor the words "thirty million."

Amendment of Second Schedule of Act No. 7 of 1993. 5. The Second Schedule to the 1994 Appropriation Act 1993 is hereby repealed and the new Second Schedule appearing herein substituted therefor. The sums expressed in the new Second Schedule shall be deemed to have been so appropriated from the 1st day of January, 1994.
