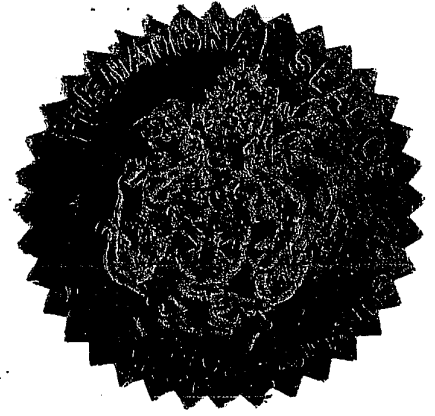

AN ACT to appropriate one hundred and seventy seven million five hundred and forty nine thousand eight hundred and forty two dollars to the service of the year ending 31st December 1990.
